


Academic Subject e-learning courses for Access to HE

Access Units are available for academic subject courses and these can be included in a Diploma's 'Rules of Combination' leading to the achievement of units. Alternatively, the courses can be used to supplement your existing teaching resources.

Each course can be used to supplement class-based teaching as part of a 'blended' offer or could be used as a stand-alone part of an Access course.

LASER Access Units are available for each of the courses and assignments will be provided to enable students to achieve credits for the units if desired.

Tutors in colleges would mark and provide feedback for assignments leading to the award of credit, just the same as for learners in classroom-based Access courses.



The list below shows the courses/units that will be available for use from September 2019 onwards. More courses are under development and we plan to add new subjects year on year. All units are worth 3 credits unless otherwise stated.
